Update in Internal Medicine 2026 (RP2605A) will be held on **Saturday, May 2, 2026**. This hybrid continuing education activity will take place both **virtually** and **live in-person** at the UT Southwestern Medical Center T. Boone Pickens Biomedical Building in Dallas, TX and is sponsored by UT Southwestern Internal Medicine Department, and the Office of Continuing Education at UT Southwestern Medical Center.

Update in Internal Medicine 2026 provides clinicians with up-to-date knowledge on the treatment of various disease states, a field that continues to expand at a rapid pace.. Every year, new therapies are being developed and new standards of care are employed across the spectrum of internal medicine. The busy primary care physician and internist, since they treat patients with varied diseases and comorbidities, are faced with the growing challenge of keeping abreast of the latest advances. The annual Update in Internal Medicine CME Conference seeks to assist clinicians in meeting this challenge. Our 2026 conference will feature didactic lectures, panel discussion, and interactive Q&A sessions, presented as a hybrid learning approach, offering the combination of a one-day live in-person presentation and pre-recorded on-demand presentations. The overall goal is to provide primary care physicians and internists with state-of-the-art practical advice on issues identified as frequent items for consultation and second opinions, as well as new advances in applying new scientific techniques and technologies in translational medicine.

This course is designed for providers in the specialties of: Family Practice, Internal Medicine and Surgery

Learning Objectives include:

- Describe the differential diagnosis for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy based on clinical history and cardiac imaging.
- Identify and discuss evidence-based approaches to the diagnosis and management of kidney stones in the primary care setting.
- Explain and apply evidence-based, risk-stratified approaches to screening and prevention strategies for sexually transmitted infections (STIs).
- Describe at least two recently approved pharmacologic therapies targeting metabolic dysfunction-associated steatosis liver disease (MASLD).
- Identify clinical features and apply a systematic, evidence-based approach to the recognition and diagnosis of giant cell arteritis, with or without polymyalgia rheumatica, in older patients presenting with compatible symptoms.
- Identify the most common clinical presentations of sarcoidosis in clinical practice.
- Apply the 5M Framework to the care of common internal medical problems faced by geriatric patients.
- Describe the current trends of increasing colon cancer among younger adults and possible lifestyle factors contributing to this change.
- List at least two pregnancy-related complications associated with acute or chronic renal disease.
- Identify the appropriate indications for polysomnography to diagnose obstructive sleep apnea.
