

#### **PURPOSE AND CONTENT**

Internal medicine is expanding at a fast pace as new therapies are developed and new guidelines are recommended across a spectrum of diseases. Busy physicians are faced with the growing challenge of keeping abreast of these changes. The annual *Update in Internal Medicine* conference offers state-of-the-art, practical advice on common conditions and exciting new developments in areas including cardiovascular and diabetes management, radiation and medical oncology, lifestyle medicine and weight wellness, and many others. The conference is presented in a hybrid learning approach: a one-day live and synchronous online presentation as well as prerecorded on-demand presentations. - Explain the roles of lifestyle management and pharmacologic therapy in patient weight management in primary care
