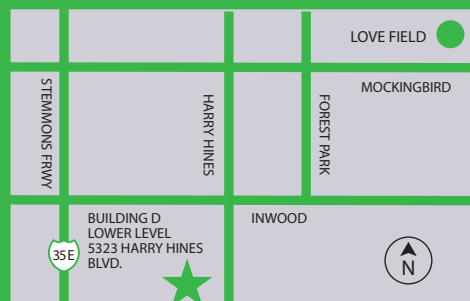
Registration


